- Eligibility:** Any U.S. Figure Skating member who maintains legal residence in New Jersey or who maintains a New Jersey U.S. Figure Skating club as their HOME CLUB is eligible to compete in these championships. The same rules apply for Maneuver team events. For the high school team event, please see the event description for eligibility rules.
- Rules:** This competition will be conducted according to the rules in the 2009-2010 Basic Skills Manual effective September 1, 2009 except as stated herein. The competition committee reserves the right to make changes marked as urgent by the May 2010 Governing Council meeting. The 6.0 judging system will be used for all events. This is a non-qualifying competition.
- Eligibility will be based on skill level as of April 21, 2010. All SNOWPLOW SAM and BASIC SKILLS SKATERS THROUGH BASIC 8 must skate at highest level passed and NO official U.S. Figure Skating tests may have been passed including MIF or individual dances.
- For the Free skate 1-6, Test Track and Well Balanced levels, eligibility will be based only upon highest free skate test level passed (moves in the field test level will not determine skater's competitive level). Skaters may skate at highest level passed OR one level higher BUT not both levels in the same event during the same competition.
- Entries:** The Local Organizing Committee (LOC) reserves the right to cancel any event due to lack of entries. If events are cancelled, skaters entered in such events may be invited to skate an exhibition if scheduling permits. Skaters who choose to skate an exhibition will not receive a refund for that event. The LOC reserves the right to combine, divide or cancel groups. If an event is cancelled by the LOC, a refund shall be made to the skater.
- Liability:** U.S. Figure Skating, the Hollydell FSC, the NJ Council of Figure Skating Clubs, the Hollydell Ice Arena, its management and employees undertake no responsibility for damage or injuries suffered by the skaters or officials. As a condition of and in consideration of the acceptance of their entries or participation therein, all entrants, their parents or guardians and officials shall be deemed to agree to assume all risks of injury to their person and property resulting from, caused by or connected with, the conduct and management of the

competition, and to waive and release any and all claims which they have against any officials, U.S. Figure Skating, the Hollydell FSC, the competition, and against its officers, and their entries shall be accepted only on such condition. USFS #3222

Deadline:

Applications will be accepted in two formats: Online (preferred) or on paper. Apply online at www.hollydellfsc.org until 11:59PM on April 21, 2010. This is a secure website requiring a credit card payment. Acceptance of your credit card will serve as acknowledgement of entry. Make sure your coach approves the level the skater has entered. Otherwise, an additional fee will be charged for any changes. Paper applications will also be available at the above website. All mail must be postmarked by April 21, 2010. In addition to the entry fee for events, all paper applications must include an **additional \$10.00** administration fee. No metered, registered or certified mail will be accepted. Post office cancellation is required.

Late applications (post marked or entered on line between April 22nd and May 5th) will be accepted at the discretion of the LOC and must include an additional \$25 late fee. No applications will be accepted after May 5, 2010.

Requests for Changes:

No changes to the schedule will be allowed to accommodate personal or family conflicts. Any requests for event/level changes, (not due to an LOC error), after the application deadline will be processed upon receipt of a \$25.00 change fee. Check must be received by mail. No changes will be made after the entries have been sent to the chief referee.

Entry Fees:

Basic Skills: \$65 first event/ \$30 second event Add \$10 for paper application

Returned checks will be subject to a \$25 reprocessing fee. The reprocessing fee PLUS entry fee must then be paid by cash, money order or certified check.

Refunds:

(USFS rule # 3233 and 3235) Entry fees will be refunded only if an event is cancelled. Should a skater elect to skate an exhibition, no refund will be given for that event. Under no other circumstances will a refund be given including conflicting family activities, injuries, or deaths in the family.

Schedules:

Schedules will be posted 7-10 days prior to the start of the competition on both www.Hollydellfsc.org (Hollydell FSC) and the NJ Council website at www.NJCFSC.org. (NJ Council website). Schedules **WILL NOT** be mailed. Please do not email for schedule information or send a self- addressed stamped envelope.

Registration/Music:

The registration desk will open one hour before the first event. Competitors are advised to be present at least one hour before their scheduled event in case the competition is running early. Pre-recorded CD's are required. No cassette tapes or iPods are allowed. Only one track per CD is allowed. Music on CD-RW type CDs will not be accepted. Music must be clearly marked with the skaters name, level and length of program and submitted one (1) hour before the start of the skater's event. **The Hollydell Skating Club of NJ assumes no responsibility or liability for damage or loss of CD's.** All competitors must have a duplicate CD with them rink side at the time their event begins. The Hollydell Figure Skating Club will provide the dance music.

Awards/Trophies:

Medals will be awarded to first, second, third and fourth place skaters in all events.

Format: Each skater will have the option to perform one element at a time in the order listed below (no excessive connecting steps) **OR** will perform each element when directed by a judge or referee.

- To be skated on 1/3 to 1/2 ice No music
- **All elements must be skated in the order listed**
- Time: 1:00 or less

Back crossovers to a back outside edge landing position clockwise and counterclockwise 4. Forward inside pivot
Basic 3 1. Forward stroking 2. Forward 1/2 swizzle pumps on a circle, either direction 6-8 consecutive 3. Moving forward to backward two foot turn - either direction 4. Backward one foot glide - either foot 5. Two foot spin	Basic 8 1. Moving forward outside or forward inside 3-turns R and L 2. Waltz jump 3. Mazurka - either direction 4. Combination move - clockwise <u>or</u> counterclockwise - two forward crossovers into FI Mohawk, step behind, step into one back crossover and step to a forward inside edge 5. Beginning one-foot upright spin - optional free foot position
Basic 4 1. Forward outside 3-turn R & L from a standstill 2. Forward outside edge on a circle clockwise or counterclockwise 3. Forward crossovers 6-8 consecutive both directions 4. Backward stroking 5. Backward snowplow stop R or L	

BASIC MUSIC PROGRAM EVENT: SNOWPLOW SAM thru BASIC 8

Format: The skating order of the required elements is optional. The elements are not restricted as to the number of times the element is executed or length of glides, number of revolutions, etc unless otherwise specified.

- To be skated on full ice
- Vocal Music is allowed
- The skater may use elements from a previous level
- A 0.2 point deduction will be taken for each element performed from a higher level
- Time: 1:00 +/- 10 seconds

Snowplow Sam - Tots 1. March followed by a two foot glide and dip 2. Forward two foot swizzles 2-3 in a row 3. Backward wiggles 2-6 in a row 4. Forward snowplow stop	Basic 5 1. Backward outside edge on a circle clockwise or counterclockwise 2. Backward crossovers 6-8 consecutive - both directions 3. One foot spin - min 3 revs 4. Hockey stop 5. Side toe hop - either direction
Basic 1 1. Forward two foot glide 2. Forward two foot swizzles 6-8 in a row 3. Forward snowplow stop 4. Backward wiggles 6-8 in a row	Basic 6 1. Forward inside 3-turn R & L from a standstill 2. Bunny hop 3. Forward spiral on a straight line R or L 4. Lunge R or L 5. T-stop R or L

Basic 2 1. Forward one foot glide - either foot 2. Forward alternating 1/2 swizzle pumps, in a straight line - across width of ice 3. Two foot turn in place forward to backward 4. Backward two foot swizzles 6-8 in a row 6. Moving snowplow stop	Basic 7 1. Forward inside open Mohawk R to L and L to R 2. Ballet jump - either direction 3. Back crossovers to a back outside edge landing position clockwise and counterclockwise 4. Forward inside pivot
Basic 3 1. Forward stroking 2. Forward 1/2 swizzle pumps on a circle, either direction 6-8 consecutive 3. Moving forward to backward two foot turn - either Direction 4. Backward one foot glide - either foot 5. Two foot spin	Basic 8 1. Moving forward outside or forward inside 3-turns R and L 2. Waltz jump 3. Mazurka - either direction 4. Combination move - clockwise or counterclockwise - two forward crossovers into FI Mohawk, step behind, step into one back crossover and step to a forward inside edge 5. Beginning one-foot upright spin - optional free leg position
Basic 4 1. Forward outside edge on a circle clockwise or Counterclockwise 2. Forward crossovers 6-8 consecutive both directions 3. Forward outside 3-turn R & L 4. Backward stroking 5. Backward snowplow stop R or L	

BASIC SKILLS FREESKATE 1-6 MUSIC EVENT

Format: The skating order of the required elements is optional. The elements are not restricted as to the number of times the element is executed or length of glides, number of revolutions, etc unless otherwise stated. Connecting moves and step should be demonstrated throughout the program

- Vocal music is allowed
- The skater must demonstrate the required elements and may use but is not required to use any additional elements from previous levels.
- A 0.2 deduction will be taken for each element performed from a higher level
- Time 1:30 +/-10 sec

Freestyle 1 1. Advanced forward stroking 4-6 strokes 2. Scratch spin from back crossovers 3. Waltz jump from back crossovers 4. Half flip jump	Freestyle 4 1. Forward power 3's - 2-3 consecutive R or L 2. Sit spin 3. Loop jump 4. Waltz jump/loop jump
Freestyle 2 1. Forward outside spiral R or L 2. Beginning back spin 3. Waltz jump, side toe hop, waltz jump 4. Toe loop	Freestyle 5 1. Camel spin 2. Forward upright spin to back upright spin 3. Loop/loop combination jump 4. Flip jump

Competitive Test Track Music Event

Skaters may enter EITHER test track free skate program or the well-balanced track free skate program but **NOT** both during the same non-qualifying competition. Competitors will skate to music of their choice, vocal music permitted.

The 6.0 judging system will be used for all Test Track events.

Deductions **WILL** be made for skaters including technical elements not permitted in the event description.

- 0.1 from EACH mark for each technical element included that is not permitted in the event description.
- 0.2 from the technical mark for each extra or lacking element.
- 0.1 for any spin with less than required revolutions.
